The Vision of the Upanishads

What is the vision of enlightenment, the quest for *moksha*, taught in the Upanishads? How is this expressed in the secret teaching Naciketas learns from Yama, the god of death, in the *Katha Upanishad*? How does the phrase 'tat tvam asi' in the Chandogya Upanishad sum up the vision of the Upanishads? What is meant by karma, and how does it pose the central problem that must be solved in attaining moksha? What is yoga and how does it lead to moksha? How does this focus on moksha mark a radical departure from the focus on yajna in the earlier Vedas? What do you think of this vision of the Upanishads?

The Vision of Jainism

How does the vision of *moksha* in Jainism both compare and contrast with the view of *moksha* in the *Upanishads*? How does the Jain notion of *karma* pose the problem that must be solved in order to attain *moksha*? What is the Jain path to liberation? What is the difference between the two sects of Jainism? What is meant by *ahimsa*, the most influential teaching of Jainism? What do you think of this teaching of *ahimsa* and the vision of Jainism?

The Vision of the Buddha

What are the Four Noble Truths taught by the Buddha? How might these four truths be explained in terms of a visit to a physician? How does the Buddhist notion of enlightenment, *nibbana* (SK: *nirvana*) compare and contrast with the notion of *moksha* in the Upanishads? Explain how the Buddhist central teaching of *paticcasamuppada* (Sk: *pratityasamutpada*) marks a departure from the central vision of the *Upanishads*? What is the point of the Buddha's teaching in the *Fire Sermon*? What is the difference between the two interpretations of the *Fire Sermon* brought out in the film *The Buddha*? What do you think of vision of the Buddha?

Grading Rubric

1) Writing 20%

Grammar, spelling, composition, and style. Your essay should be well organized. There should be an introduction, development of a theme, and a conclusion.

2) Philosophical Content 50%

The essay should reflect an adequate understanding of the texts. Your exposition of the text should include *at least two quotations* from the primary text material. All quotes should be properly marked within the text and must include a reference to the text cited.

3) Commentary 30%

Your own thoughtful reflections on the topic.
